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Q: What if my Flickr screen name is not available on Yahoo!? What if I already have two accounts with different names? Other people already know my Flickr web address (flickr.com/photos/youralias) - why does it have to change?!?

A: Don't worry, it's cool. **Your Flickr screen name does not and will not need to be changed.** Sorry to be so large and green about it, but this part needs to be clear: you can keep your existing screenname. The Yahoo! ID is just what you need to sign in to the site (a unique identifier so we know you are, and a password so you can prove it) - it's ok if that ID is not the same as your Flickr screen name. Your Flickr and main Yahoo! profiles can be different, no problem. Your Flickr web address will remain the same and no links will break (we hate broken links almost as much as we hate spam). It's not going to change.
